Offaly took the spoils in the opening round of this Allianz
Football League
Division 3 South encounter in sundrenched conditions in Aughrim. A solid first half display by the Faithful County laid the foundation for this victory. A goal on the stroke of

halftime, dealt Davy Burke's charges a huge blow.

Both sides traded chances in the opening moments, before Mark Jackson saved brillianty from a Peter Cunningham piledriver, the ball fell to Ruairí McNamee, who fisted over a point for the opening score of the game in the 6th minute. Offaly lost possession in the middle of the park, Conor Byrne gathered the ball and made a darting run through the Offaly rearguard and offloaded to the onrunning Eoin Darcy, the Tinahely man drilled his shot to the top right hand corner, a tonic start for the Garden County outfit. Back came Offaly with a Bernard Allen effort, his goalbound shot was saved brilliantly by Jackson out for a 45, goalie Paddy Dunican split the uprights from the resultant 45. Pádraig O'Toole bombed over a point for the homeside in the 10th minute. Offaly then took a stranglehold on proceedings, moving forward at pace, breaking through tackles, tallying on three points, the pick of them from Jordan Hayes right boot. The first water break followed with Offaly leading 0-5 to 1-1.

Offaly harvested the next four points on the bounce before Dean Healy stopped the rot with an excellent point for Wicklow in the 33rd minute. A long range point from the boot of Mark Jackson cut the deficit to three, as the homeside found some momentum going into injury time. However Wicklow were dealt a massive blow as wing back Colm Doyle guided the ball into Jackson's net, seconds before the half time whistle sounded, as Offaly now led 1-9 to 1-3 at the interval.

Wicklow had the better of chances on the restart, Kiltegan's Pádraig O'Toole cursed his luck as his low piledriver took the paintwork of the wrongside of the upright, Andy Maher landed a superb point in the 4th minute. Conor Byrne picked up a Black Card and was off for the next ten minutes, another blow to the homesides cause. Offaly had two great chances of increasing the lead, but some tenacious tackling by Nicky Devereux cleared the danger. Bill Carroll pointed from a mark, for the visitors in the 17th minute of the 2nd half, as the waterbreak was signalled. Each side introduced a number of fresh legs as players on both sides started to cramp up in the warm conditions.

On resumption, Cian Farrell picked up a Black Card for Offaly for a pull down on an opponent. Avondale's Conor Byrne returned to the fray and raised Wicklow's 5th white flag of the game, to cut the margin to 5. Niall McNamee replied with a point before Eoin Darcy found the target with a sweet point. Wicklow upped the ante as Mark Jackson pointed from a placed ball before an excellent point from Dean Healy, cut the deficit to three. Offaly put some daylight between the sides again with a brace of points before Dean Healy pointed his 3rd of the afternoon. Niall McNamee put the result beyond doubt with a point for John Maughan's side, before Mark Kenny closed out proceedings with a point for the homeside.

Wicklow will make the long journey to Thurles next Saturday, in a huge encounter in a must win game against the reigning Munster champions, Tipperary.

Wicklow put up a spirited performance but ultimately came up short in their battle with Munster Champions
Tipperary in their Division 3 game in Thurles on Saturday.

Wicklow, who made 3 late changes to the starting fifteen started the brighter

with Dean Healy sending a high ball in to Seanie Furlong who fielded and fisted over the opening score inside the opening minute.

In the 5th minute JP Hurley was shown a black card for pulling down his opponent near the halfway line. Frees from Sean O'Connor and a point from play from Steven O'Brien helped Tipperary open up 0-4 to 0-1 lead after 10 minutes.

Wicklow soon found their stride and were very unfortunate not to have had the games first goal only for goalkeeper Michael O'Reilly to pull off a good double save to deny Conor Byrne. However points from Andy Maher, Eoin Darcy and Podge O'Toole had Wicklow level at the Water Break.

Tipperary started the 2nd quarter well and Conor Sweeney nearly took full advantage of a long ball into the square only to see his fisted effort deflect wide of Mark Jacksons goal. Straight from the kickout Darcy nipped in off the right and fisted a lovely score to put Wicklow back into the lead 0-5 to 0-4.

Soon after Maher was forced from the field to be replaced by Kevin Quinn who set up Niall Donnelly from the resulting restart to knock over another score.

On the half hour Tipperary struck for their first goal. A well worked team move which resulted in Conor Sweeney stroking the ball under Jackson into the net. Jackson helped repair some of the damage by converting a wonderful free from near the "65" for the final score of the half, sending the teams in level 1-4 to 0-7.

The second half started off slowly with only 4 points in the opening fifteen minutes, two Tipperary frees with Jackson and Furlong replying for Wicklow.

Tipperary then struck for their 2nd goal in the 52nd minute when a handpass by Nicky Devereux went astray and debutant Shane Ryan received a pass from Sweeney to finish low into the net and put his side up by 3 for the first time since early in the opening period 2-6 to 0-9. This was soon extended to 4 with a nicely taken score from wide on the right and brought up the Water Break.

Wicklow kept in the game with attacking runs especially from Quinn who won a free that was tapped over by Murtagh to help reduce the margin to three with a 16 minutes to go. Wicklow then had a great chance of a goal only for Quinn to blaze wide after great build up.

Tipperary kept the scoreboard ticking over with points from the likes of Sweeney and O'Connor but with 6 minutes left Wicklow were thrown a lifeline when Tipperary defender Emmet Moloney was shown a second yellow card for a dangerous tackle.

Wicklow struggled to take advantage and another score from Steven O'Brien extended Tipperary's lead 2-11 to 0-11.

With time running out Mark Kenny knocked over a point from a difficult angle and when Jackson knocked over his 3rd free the lead was all of a sudden down to 4 with six minutes of additional time given.

Tipperary showed their experience but Davy Burkes

side never gave up and Kevin Quinn won a penalty in the dying moments that was eventually given by referee Seamus Mulvihill after talking to all his officials. The penalty was coolly slotted by Furlong to reduce the deficit. Unfortunately for Wicklow the final whistle blew immediately after.

Wicklow now host Limerick next Saturday in a must win encounter to have a chance of staying in Division 3.

Wicklow made the short journey down to Netwatch Cullen Park on Sunday afternoon to take on the hosts Carlow, in the opening round of the Allianz 2A National Hurling League. This was always going to be a very stern test for Eamonn Scallan's charges, with Carlow

coming down from the Liam MacCarthy last season to ply their trade in the Joe McDonagh Cup this coming season.

Blustery cross-field windy conditions weren't very suitable for the small ball game throughout. Both sides traded chances in the opening moments but to no avail. Carlow's Chris Nolan opened the scoring with a point in the 7th minute. Carlow's next two points came from defensive mistakes by the Wicklow rear-guard. Wicklow got off the hook when Chris Nolan gathered possession from a short puck-out and his shot somehow blazed over the crossbar. It would be the twelfth minute before Christy Moorehouse registered Wicklow's first score, a point from a placed ball. Carlow replied with a brace of points before Christy Moorehouse landed the Garden County's second and third points before the Galway official signalled for the 1st waterbreak, as the hosts led 0-7 to 0-3.

Another pointed free by Christy cut the deficit to three on the restart. It was a shootout between both opposing free takers as every free was blown up early with little or no advantage being allocated by the Galway official. Christy Moorehouse and Marty Kavanagh exchanged pointed frees before the half time whistle sounded with the scoreboard now reading 0-13 to 0-8 in favour of the Barrowsiders. Carlow took a stranglehold on the game on the restart when Marty Kavanagh landed a major from an acute angle, after sidestepping two defenders, firing low to the back of the net. Bray's Eoin McCormack landed the Garden County's first point from play in the next attack after collecting a great pass in from Shaun Cranley. Wicklow introduced a trio of fresh legs to the fray, however the hosts rallied with scores from Jack and Marty Kavanagh and Craig Wall to build up a ten point cushion as the 2nd half water break was signalled, the scoreboard now read 1-17 to 0-10.

Another major soon followed from the hurl of the Carlow number 13, who was on song through-out the

70 odd minutes. Glenealy's Danny Staunton fired over two long range points before a Ross Smithers goal sealed the deal for Tom Mullally's side, however Wicklow rallied in the closing moments with Andy O'Brien landing an outrageous point before Mikey Lee split the posts, with both men laying down markers for a starting spot next day out. Andy O'Brien found the target again before a brace of points from Michael Boland closed out the game. Wicklow will play Meath in Round 2 in Aughrim this coming Saturday at 3pm.

Meath were the visitors to Aughrim for this Round 2 encounter of the Allianz Hurling League and the Royals took home the spoils in a very wet, damp and miserable Aughrim. Wicklow lined out with a number of

changes in personel from last weekends starting fifteen in Carlow.

Eamonn Scallan's side started the brighter in the opening exchanges with Bray's Eoin McCormack firing

over a sweet point for the opening score in the third minute. Meath replied with full forward Mark O'Sullivan levelling matters in the next attack. Christy Moorehouse opened his account from a placed ball after great play by the Danny Staunton to edge Wicklow ahead.

Tenacious defending by the Wicklow backs, with two great blocks, denying certain points for the Royals in the next period followed. However, Patrick Conneely restored parity in the next play with a long range point.

A powerful high ball into the danger zone was gathered by Andy O'Brien who left

two defenders in his wake and Andy's rocket of a shot was brilliantly tapped over the crossbar by the Meath netminder, from the first real goal chance of the game. Again Meath replied with a pointed free before Luke Evans cut a dashing run through the heart of the Meath rear guard, and Evans himself struck over a sublime point. Wicklow lost possession after a late hit went unpunished by the referee, Meath broke up the field to add a point, then Daithi McGowan picked up a yellow card for the late hit after a linesman call. Wicklow were guilty of turning over possession and were punished when Gavin McGowan levelled proceedings, just before the 1st water break was summoned.

Well if both sides didn't get enough water on board during the interval, they got it in bucketful's as they lined up for the restart, monsoon conditions with driving rain followed over the next couple of minutes. The Meath men were finding their range far easier, accumulating three pointed frees on the bounce. James Kelly and Mark O'Sullivan stretched out the Royal's lead out to 5, with a point apiece as Wicklow

struggled in the wet conditions. As the half time whistle sounded the scoreboard read 0-10 to 0-

Meath pointed on the restart from another placed ball. Good work and quick thinking by Danny Staunton bought a free for Andy O'Brien who fired over to stem the Royal onslaught. However Meath were finding their comrades with greater ease all over the pitch and tagged on a couple of points to stretch out the lead, one following from a blatant push in the back on John Henderson. Christy Moorehouse and Jack Regan traded pointed

frees as Wicklow brought on fresh legs. Christy fired over another pointed free as the water break was signalled, with Meath now leading 0-14 to 0-8. Another Regan point was followed by a powerful score from Danny Staunton as the home side found some momentum. However some wayward shooting





from placed balls went amiss from a number of Wicklow free taker's in the next period before Moorehouse landed Wicklow's tenth white flag. Regan added a brace of points for Meath going into the closing stages. Michael Mangan who was keeping full forward Mark O'Sullivan fairly quiet through out proceedings took one for the team, when he took out an opponent bearing down on goal. This resulted in a penalty and a yellow card for the Wicklow fullback, who was off into the bin under the new rule in hurling, was signalled by the match referee. Up stepped Jack Regan to look for the first major of the game, however goalie, Conor McNally was up to the task and saved the peno.

Andy O'Brien was clean through on goal and it appeared like he was cleaned out as he was going to pull the trigger, "play on" was the call from the ref as we entered the dying minutes of the game. Gary Byrne was busy defending in the next couple off plays, clearing anything that came his way. However, Adam Gannon fired over a brace of points as the full time whistle sounded. Wicklow will seriously have to improve on a tally of 5 points from play going forward into the next Sunday where they will meet Down in Aughrim at 2pm.

These new rules are in for all club competitions including 2020 competitions not completed. Should any conflict arise between the information contained in this document and the text of the latest GAA Official Guides, the text of the latest GAA Official Guides shall prevail.

The following new rules changes only apply at Inter-County in 2021

The issung of Yellow & Red Cards to Team Officials for Misconduct at Games.

This will be introduced at club level in January 2022.

Denying a goalscoring opportunity.

Only applies to Senior Inter-County League & Championship in 2021.

Seven substitutions at five separate occasions.

This was a temporary rule change for the Allianz League 2021 ONLY

Minor hurling

The county minor hurling management team has been announced and ratified by the County Board . Dara Kissane is the new manager and he is being assisted by Karl Cooke of Kilcoole ,Pat Brennan of Blessington and Colm French of Glenealy. Dara is also the S&C coach with the senior hurling team.

They commenced their preparations on Saturday the 22nd with trial games in Ballinakill. They had a great turnout of 50 players divided into 3 teams and played 3 x 30 minute games. The team management were very happy with both the commitment and indeed standard of skill on display. They continue with another trial game in Ballinakill on Saturday 29th. A panel will be announced later in the week to commence training twice a week with a few challenge games in between.

This team will compete in the Celtic cup for the CORN MICHAEL HOGAN. Their first game is against Roscommon on Sat 3rd of July.

New Refereees needed

The 2021 Referees Committee is chaired by Eddie Leonard, secretary is Fintan Fanning, with committee members: Ciaran Goff, Eire Og, Robert Roche, Carnew, and William Byrne, Avondale.

The function of the Committee is as follows:

"be responsible for the Administration and Development of Refereeing in the County, including the recruitment, training, assessment and classification of referees".

Referees make a huge commitment to the development of all GAA sports, juvenile and adult at every standard. Indeed, a growing number of our referees are being invited to consider a role at provincial level and at national level.

There is a constant need to identify individuals who would be good and willing to referee. Currently the panel is about 50 people who referee underage and adults in all codes.

With the increase demand in the time available combined with withdrawals due to COVID fears, age, etc. comes an additional requirement for new referees.

Without an increase in referee numbers CCC will be unable to guarantee referees for all games in the coming season.
