• At a well-attended Annual Meeting of the Ballymanus GAA Club Pat Carthy was elected Chairman

• At the County Convention held in Ashford a commission report aiming to restructure the GAA within the county was passed unanimously. Pat Murphy (Chairman) appealed to the delegates for to support the recommendations that will put the county on a strong base to go forward.

• At the Valleymount GAA Club Annual Meeting Tommy Tipper was elected secretary of the Club for the 32nd year. Peter Behan was elected chairman.

• Jimmy Shaughnessy (outgoing secretary) in his report to the club's AGM warned that unless drastic measures were taken, hurling and football in Rathdrum would fade out completely in the next four years. • Wicklow Vocational Schools team reached the Leinster Final when they defeated Wexford 2-14 to 1-4. Larry Tompkins scoring seven points was top scorer for the "Garden County".

• Bray Emmets Ceili Dancers won through to the Leinster Scor Finals when they won they qualified at the County Wicklow Finals.

• Wicklow were crowned Leinster Vocational School Champions when captained by Larry Tompkins they defeated Offaly 1-13 to 0-10.
