THE YEAR

The league campaign kicked off in March against Newtown with the groups ambitions to build on last year, win Division 1A and be promoted to Division 1. We progressed through the league winning 6 of our 7 games and drawing only with Kiltegan. This strong run saw us top the table at the end of league campaign, and winners of the 'Corn Na Saggart' cup.

At this stage the league split into two, with the top 4 teams of Division 1A playing off for promotion to Division 1 and the 'West Wicklow Cup'. We would continue our momentum winning all three games against Kiltegan, Avondale and Kilmacanogue. This secured promotion to Division 1 for 2024 and a league final against Avondale to look forward to.

The final against Avondale was held in Aughrim, and after a poor first half where we trailed by 12 points at the break. The lads rallied, putting in a huge second half performance to win on a score line of 3-13 to 3-09 and in doing so securing the West Wicklow Cup.



THE YEAR



2023 was a fantastic year for minor football in An Tóchar. The club were well represented on the county minor panel by, Matthew Fox, Joe Heatly, Josh Healy and Eanna Nolan. At club level the group got together for the first time back in February where the panel met up and this group set out very clearly what they wanted to achieve for the year.

Many groups in the county set out with similar goals and ambitions, but what set this bunch or players apart from other groups was the hard work they were willing to put in to turn their dream into reality. The team commenced our season playing a number of "player pathway" and challenge games where all players, including a number of U-15 players were able to get plenty of football and opportunities to develop.

At the end of May the county minors finished up and the full panel were together for the first time. The full panel headed to Westmeath where to play Moate All Whites in a challenge, stayed overnight and went Kayaking and participating in water sports activities the following day.

This was a great team building weekend that set the team on the right path for their year to start in earnest as ONE group.

At the end of June, the U15's & U16's in this panel were invited to play a 7-a-side competition in Tinryland GAA club in Carlow with teams from Laois, Kilkenny, Carlow, Wicklow and Dublin. This was a long day but proved to be a great day out with the lads celebrating Cillian Byrne's birthday by beating Cuala from





Dublin the final of the shield to pick up our first piece of silverware for the year.

The first phase of our U-17 championship campaign started in June where the team were drawn in a group with St. Kevins, St. Nicks. Annacurra, Tomnafinoque and Michael Hogans. This group contained four group teams and the winner of the U15 championship from two years ago so promised some tough games and it did not disappoint. The lads won all five games in this group coming from behind in a number of them including two thrillers at home against Annacurra and Tomnafinoque where the team came from 7 and 8 points behind respectively. By this stage this team was gaining a lot interest and super support from the people of Roundwood - filling the stand for our home games. However, this phase of the competition came with a blow, something that turned out to be more serious than originally thought. In our third game, in what seemed like a pretty innocuous clash, one of our mid fielders. Eoin Medlycott tore his ACL sustaining an injury that would ultimately finish his season on the field. However, despite his injury and disappointment, in what epitomises the mindset of this group, Eoin showed great leadership and continued to come training and be and active member of the panel for the rest of the year.

Topping this group brought us into a new group of six teams for the second phase of championship with Annacurra and Tomnafinogue also qualifying from our group along with the top three teams from the other side of the draw – AGB, Eire Og and Blessington. The stakes now were increasing with every game. There was very little room for slipping up as the top two only qualified for the minor A final with no semi-final or back door. As in the first phase of the competition the lads did things the hard way in a number of games. The team went to Arklow to play AGB who were being branded "unbeatable"

following their performances in the first group and things did not look great when the lads went five points down in the first half. However, as with several other games, this team refused to accept defeat and the players fought their way back into the game winning 1-14 to 2-08.

Next up was Tomnafinogue again in what proved to be one of our hardest games all year. The lads started well and were leading by a point at half time, but they fought back and were leading the game by four points going into injury time. Once again, this team showed their true character

with Denis Leacy, Matthew Fox and Seán McHugh winning a few crucial turnovers as full time approached before Josh Healy drove forward scoring an injury time point which was followed by a goal from Éanna Nolan in what turned out to be the last play of the game. The game ended in a draw 1-10 each — remaining the only unbeaten team in the competition.

After this the lads defeated Annacurra again and got a Walk Over from Eire Og which meant the team had now secured a place in the county final with one game still to play – away to Blessington. However, as the season was pushing towards the crucial phase our injury count was increasing with both our

regular corner backs picking up injuries at training and at one point it looked like they could have been ruled out of the County final. Denis Leacy had a suspected broken ankle which thankfully turned out to be much less serious and Cillian Byrne sustained a fractured finger which ultimately ruled him out until a few days before the final. Denis came back for our last game against Blessington where he only lasted a few minutes before having to be substituted for his younger brother Enda.

These injuries created opportunities for several other players and by the time the nine group games in the championship were played, 22 players got game time in the championship and had seen 12 different scorers, illustrating the strength and depth within the panel of players.

All of this ultimately led the panel us to where they had targeted to get to back in February – in county Minor A final for the first time in 31 years. A three week wait followed, which I am sure felt like an eternity for these lads at this point, but at the same time it allowed time for some of the lads on the injured list to get right.

On October 30th, Bank holiday Monday, that day arrived, and the lads took to the field in Aughrim to face a very fancied Tomnafinogue team for the third time this year. An Tochar got off to a great start with Seán McHugh knocking the throw-in down to Josh Healy who picked out Joe Heatly with a great pass. Joe found our team captain, Éanna Nolan, at corner forward and Éanna went on a driving run and had the ball in their net after 17 seconds. Josh then got a point after a one-two with Conor Byrne, and followed that shortly after with another goal where Joe broke a long ball down to Joseph McDonnell who calmly slotted it away with his right foot. The lads were then leading by 2-1 to 0-0 after eight minutes.

However, that would be all the scores the lads would get in the first half, despite some really lovely football including a dazzling run from Ryan Healy where he left two defenders sitting on the ground watching as he narrowly missed the target. To their credit, Tomnafinoque fought back into the game and cut the deficit to two points by the break. Our defence worked incredibly hard during this period with JJ Brady doing a great job as sweeper and the rest of the backs all playing their part. Declan Murphy also made a fantastic save when they did manage to breach our defence and get in one on one with our keeper. Tomnafinoque did get some help from the referee with some rather soft decisions, especially where Matthew Fox won a great ball, got pulled to the ground by two players on his way out and somehow managed to have a free awarded against him for over carrying. Nobody could understand that one! That said they missed a few relatively

easy frees in this period so the lads rode their luck in that regard.

An Tochar got the first score in the second half with a free from Éanna after Joe was fouled. Shortly after this, things took a turn for the worse when Denis Leacy was shown a straight red card, in what seemed like a pretty harsh decision, after only seven minutes in the second half. The teams exchanged a couple of points with Joseph getting a lovely point off his left. They then got a goal to level the game before Joe Heatly scored an amazing point after a super piece of work from João Vitor to carry the ball up the field and pass to Joe. After this Tomnafinoque scored their second goal following what seemed like a certain free for || was not given when he was taken down as he attempted to come away with the ball.

There were eight minutes left. The lads were two points down, a man down and legs beginning to get tired. Kye Murray and Brian Medlycott were brought on and boy did this give the other twelve on the field a new lease of life. As they had done several times before this year they decided "We will not be beaten todav..."

All over the field they all stepped up a gear - from Cillian Byrne to Luca Nolan to our other Killan Byrne up to Joseph and Joe who now looked like they were in the half back line. Tomnafinoque would not score again and the lads would get three more points to win.

Our first came from tenacious work from João who had more turnovers than any other player on the day. He dispossessed their keeper and feed Joseph who calmly slotted over to bring his tally to 1-2, making him top scorer in the final. The next came when Éanna was tackled around the neck and taken down when bursting through and Joe stepped up to convert the free.
