It was another strong year in Donard/Glen GAA across the entire club. Our members were kept very busy on the playing front between our two adult men's teams, Gaelic 4 Mothers and Others team and juvenile teams, but were also working hard in the background running the Club Lotto, Healthy Club initiative, Irish Speaking Mondays, and a host of other activities.

Intermediate

For the Intermediates, the year got off to a flying start with the club hosting the Jim Mills Memorial Cup. Valleymount, Hollywood and Dunlavin joined in to make it a highly competitive and well-run tournament. There was great attendance at all games and the crowds were rewarded with high-quality football throughout February. The club's two pitches were used, and both were in great condition despite the early stage of the year. The tournament went down to the final day and competition was fierce with the two final games throwing in at the same time. Dunlavin came out the eventual winners, but all teams will be keen to go at it again in 2024.

Our Intermediates were under new management this year and had a strong showing in both the league and championship. Building on the sharpness gained from the Jim Mills tournament and fitness from pre-season training, a win against Baltinglass saw the team get off to a good start in the league. Further wins against the likes of Ashford, Ballymanus, Valleymount and Eire Og resulted in a mid-table finish and well set up for championship.

The group format championship got under way in August with good wins over Carnew Emmets and Kilmacanogue. Losses to Valleymount and Annacurra set up a must win final group game against Laragh with Donard/Glen coming out on top. A powerful quarter final win against Hollywood in Blessington

set up an October semi-final versus Annacurra in Aughrim. This was a tight game with nothing spared by either team and fine football throughout. After a gruelling second half, Donard/Glen looked to have secured the win only for Annacurra to power back with some late scores which unfortunately proved the difference and ended championship hopes for 2023. This team is a mixture of youth and experience with many underage honours and intermediate medals already in hand.

With more experienced gained in 2023, and the management moving into their second season, there is a lot to look forward to with this team in the coming year.

Junior B

After taking home the Junior C title in 2022, our recently promoted Junior team had another good year. Again, it was strong showing in a team which featured many familiar faces



from the senior and intermediate teams of years gone along with plenty of up-and-coming players. The football started in early March with strong performances against Baltinglass, Kilbride and Kiltegan in the Hennessy Cup. Despite some good wins, score difference prevented the team advancing from the group.

In the league, the strong squad and good numbers were not matched across the other teams in the west. Donard/Glen easily advanced without a major test. The season properly got going in the quarter final game against Kilcoole, with the win coming in extra time. A strong 7-point win over Annacurra in the semi-final paved the way for a final against Ballymanus. Donard/Glen ran out 3-10 to 1-14 winners to claim the Division 5 Macra Na Feirme title for 2023 and bring home a cup for a second year in a row.

It was a huge step up in the Junior B championship this year. Beaten by Avoca and Baltinglass in the first two games, a big win was needed against Kilcoole, and the Juniors roundly delivered. The team went through on score difference to a well-deserved quarter final. Despite being beaten by a strong Tinahely team it was nonetheless a successful year for this Junior team with a cup from the league, Junior B status secured, experience gained by younger players and plenty of good football played.

Healthy Club

The Donard/Glen Healthy Club initiative has achieved Foundation Level with plans in place to step up to the next level. Well run and enjoyable gym classes are a huge contributor to the success of this initiative, making sure the club gym is open and welcoming to members of all abilities for fun, supervised sessions throughout the year.

Donard/Glen would like to thank all who played, volunteered, and supported the club throughout the year. It takes a huge effort to develop and support our players, maintain and expand our facilities, and run our games and initiatives over the course of a season. 
St Nicholas Juveniles

The St. Nicholas u12 team participated in the Kildare league, winning the Kildare division 5 league. The team reached the Allen Cup semi-final, narrowly missing out to Blessington in extra time. The St. Nicholas u13 had a good showing in the league and reached a shield final, losing to Baltinglass despite a great effort. The St. Nicholas u15's fielded two teams this year, reaching a Wicklow League Final and winning the Wicklow Feile. Representing Wicklow in Feile, the team reached the semi-final just losing out in extra time. Both teams reached championship finals with one team beating Rathnew in the A final and the other team just losing out to a strong Clara Gaels side in the D final. The St. Nicholas minor team did very well this year with a win in the B championship final against St Kevin's. Overall, a very successful year with good commitment shown by players and mentors alike.

Juveniles

It was a busy year for the Donard/Glen Juveniles with over 100 registered players. Training on Monday nights and Saturday mornings, the Coiste na nÓg u11s played 10 games in the Wicklow League, winning 6. The u9s had 24 players regularly training, fulfilled all Go Game fixtures, and developed great skills throughout the year. The u7s had 30 registered with around 20 players regularly attending training sessions. Go Games were very well attended and much like the U9s. skill development over the year was very good within this age group. Finally, the Nursery team had 28 registered players with 18 of these remaining eligible for Nursery again this year and 10 moving up to u7s. Due to the hard work of the juvenile coaches and admins, the juvenile section of Donard/Glen GAA continues to prosper, and the club looks forward to seeing these players move up through the grades and continue to participate for years to come.

We had the chances and we were considered unlucky against Tinahely and Rathnew. Rathnew went all the way to the SFC Final, and we ended up in a Relegation Final with Avondale who had drawn with Blessington (2023 SFC champions) in their previous match. A very encouraging performance in the Knockananna final resulted in a 7-point win against Avondale and retaining our senior Championship status for 2024. There is no doubt, this team has the potential to go all the way and hopefully we can build on this year going forward.

Juvenile football



After that process we ratified a planning group sub-committee who are in the process of completing a club plan, their works are coming towards the draft stage, It is intended to circulate the draft Plan to members for constructive input and then finalised, published and hopefully used as a support tool to the club as it develops. Publication will be in spring 2024.

We had our top field maintained with some sand slitting and shock waving. Our lighting has been completed around the pitch, ensuring it is a safe space for walkers, this is of massive benefit to not only the club but the wider community. It gives everyone a safe environment to walk in the dark winter evenings and now we have enrolled in the "healthy clubs" initiative, we hope to take part in 'Ireland Lights Up' and more exciting events in the new year.

Our public toilets, storerooms and dressing room 1 & 2 are currently under renovation, the standard we hope to deliver is of the highest quality and we are very excited to see the finished product. We have also submitted a grant application

for Phase II of the clubhouse development so hopefully our application is successful, and we can keep on improving our facilities. These development projects don't just happen though, they have all been two years in the making and lots of hours of meetings, brainstorming, grant applications, meeting deadlines and fundraising thank you for all your hard work and dedication to improve our facilities for the club and wider community.


Seniors
