THE YEAR

Training commenced on Tuesday 28th February in preparation for the 2023 season. The Under 12 girls trained twice a week, on Tuesday at 7.00pm & Thursday 6.00pm. By the end of October, the team had completed approximately 70 training sessions.

30 girls were registered to play at the start of the session, and were delighted to add two more players to our ranks during the season and end the season with 32 girls. The girls always worked hard and trained with a positive attitude and over the course of the season showed great improvement in terms of individual skills and fitness and also in terms of team play, use of the ball and tactical awareness.

Due to our great numbers, the club were able to enter two teams into the Under 12 leagues. No championship exists at this age group.

During the 2023 season the 2011 girls played in Division 1. They played home and away fixtures against AGB, Baltinglass, Blessington, Bray Emmets, Eire Óg, St. Patrick's and Tinahely. The girls performed very strongly in the league, benefiting hugely from the challenging division they had played in last season. In particular the coaches were delighted to see them finish many games with a high

number of points as opposed to goals, which can be common at this age group. This high level of point kicking bodes well for their future. Some of these girls also played up with the Under 14's when requested and always acquitted themselves well.

The 2012 girls played in Division 2, playing home and away fixtures against Annacurra, AGB, Ashford, Blessington, Clara, Kilcoole, St. Nicholas and Valleymount. The 2012 girls always competed excellently in this division despite mainly being up against the first teams of other clubs. Their league campaign was notable for the determination and spirit with which they played in every game, and theres no doubt this challenging division will be a big benefit to them in 2024 as it was to our 2011 girls this year. The 2012 girls also played up, when requested, with the 2011 girls in division 1 and always performed brilliantly.

The girls also played a good number of challenge games against various opposition throughout the season. As well as taking part in the David Cullen Memorial Day in Laragh and the Eire Óg mini tournament.

The girls gave great support to the clubs Race Night Fundraiser this season, exceeding the target the team had set themselves. A highlight of the session, as it is every year, was our trip to Croke Park during the summer to watch the LGFA All-Ireland Finals, and to wrap up the season with great day in Bray, bowling, gaming and eating Mc Donald's!!

THE YEAR

2023 was a successful year for the Under 16 girls with a squad of 31 girls born in 2007 and 2008.

The team commenced training in mid Feb 2023 and by the time of our last match on 24-Sep had completed 60+ training sessions and played in 28 matches. A number of our 2008 girls also were part of the Wicklow U15 development squad and attended multiple training sessions and matches. The club also had 4 Under 16 girls that were called to the Wicklow Under 16 squad who made it to the Under 16 C championship final. With the help of the U14 squad the club were able to field 2 Under 16 An Tochar Girls teams in both League and Championship for the very first time. The girls performed well in our League Division 1 and Division 2 campaigns - finishing 4th in a very competitive Division 1 and ending up as League Champions in Division 2.

In the Championship the club were graded in A and B. In A championship the club finished top of our group which included St Nicks, Eire Og and Blessington. This qualified us for a home semi-final against AGB. Unfortunately, the team lost narrowly in a very close contest which could have gone either way. In B championship they girls again progressed to the Semi Final but our mix of U14 and Under 16 girls were beaten by a Baltinglass 1st team that were moved down from A championship.

In conjunction with the Ladies team management, the club were also able to give the majority of the Under 16 girls the opportunity to play Junior Ladies League and Championship. Some Under 16s who played Intermediate Championship for the first time.
